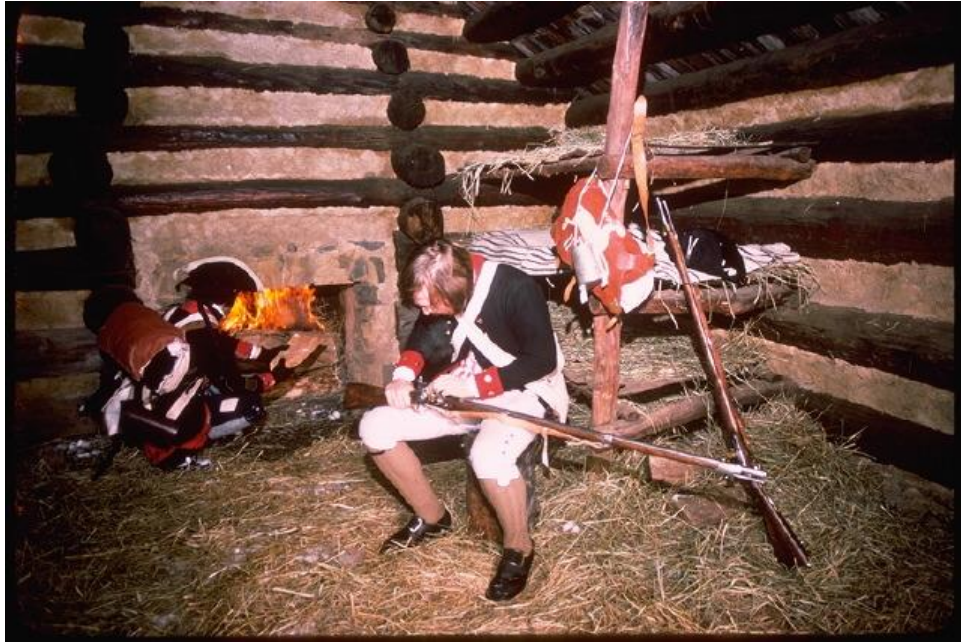

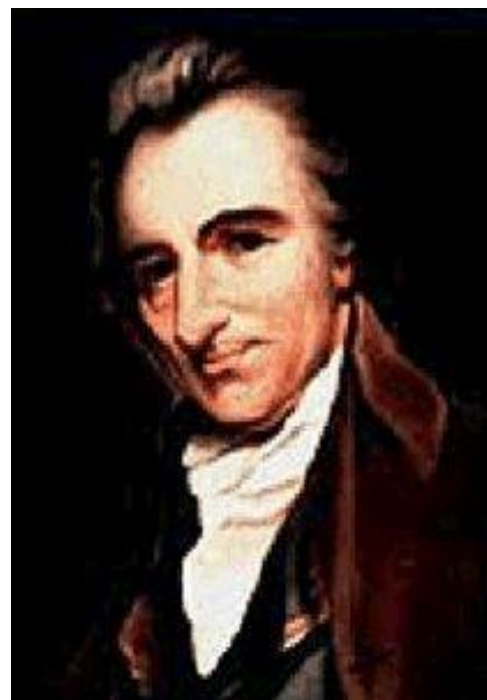
Thomas Paine

The lowest point of the Revolutionary War in which thousands of soldiers died of starvation and disease.



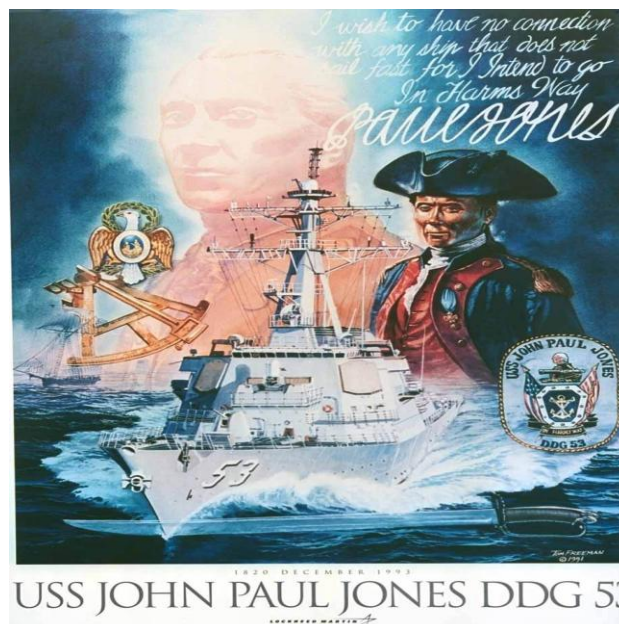
Valley Forge

Battle of Yorktown



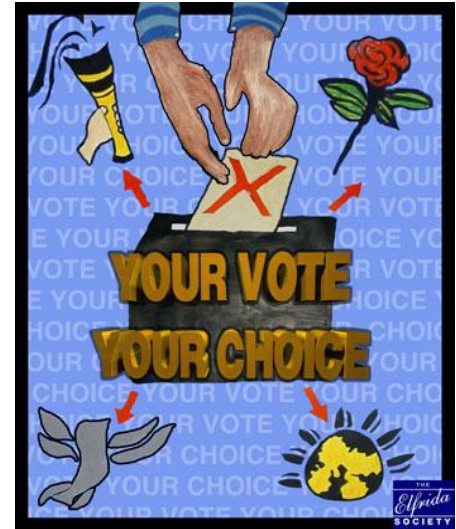
The Treaty that officially ended the American Revolution in which Americans gained all land west of the Mississippi River.



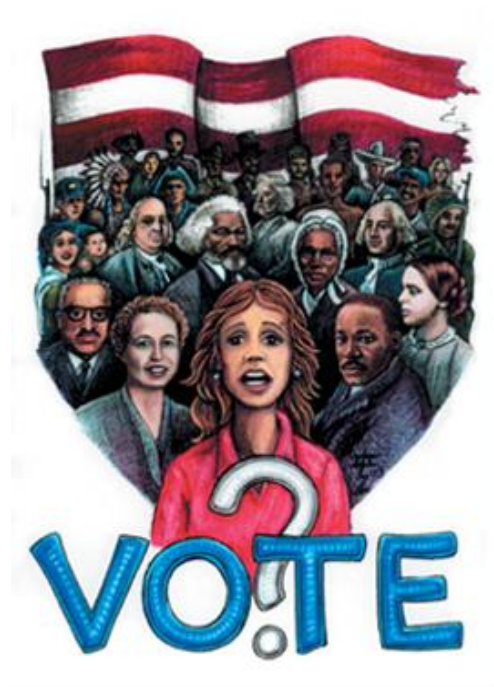
Treaty of Paris 1783
